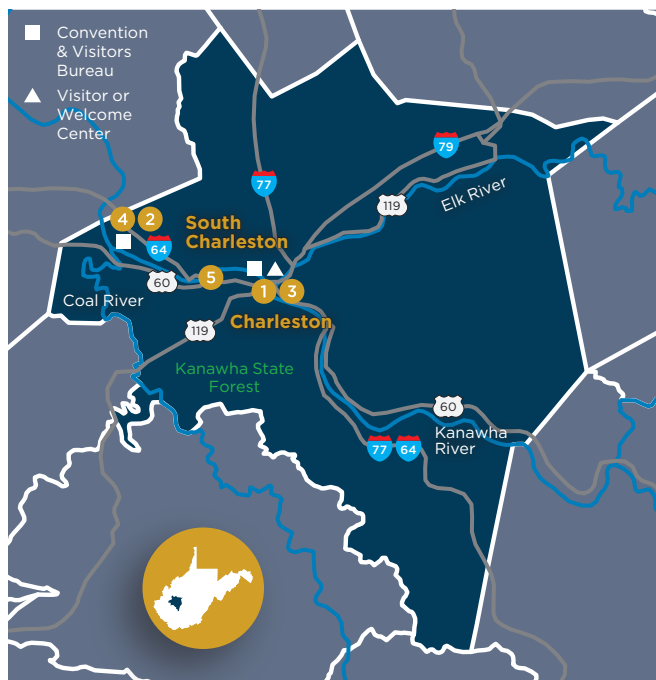

SPRING HILL PASTRY SHOP

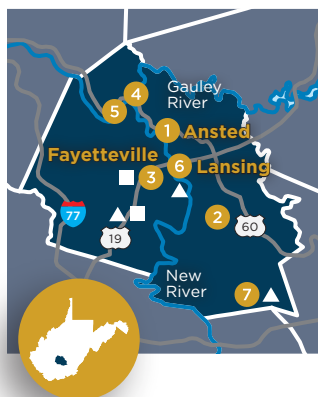

MYSTERY HOLE West Virginia's own believe-it-or-not, the Mystery Hole defies the laws of gravity. Explore underground where both water and balls go uphill.

2 Clintontop

GLADE CREEK GRIST MILL

The mill, one of the state's most

recognizable icons, is a living monument to the thriving mills of WV's past. Snap a selfie, and pick up a bag of authentic, freshly ground cornmeal produced on-site.

3 Fayetteville

BRIDGE BREW WORKS

This two-man show keeps busy producing over a dozen different styles of craft beer. Visit their website to see where you can get your hands on some, or stop by the brewery to fill up your growler.

BRIDGE DAY Come watch daredevils rappel, skydive or jump from the New River Gorge Bridge at one of WV's biggest annual events, or sit back and enjoy the food and live music.

CATHEDRAL CAFE Visit this church-turned-café for a cup of coffee and a meal, and enjoy the relaxed atmosphere, regional art and beautiful stained-glass.

SECRET SANDWICH SOCIETY Despite the name, it's no secret how great these sandwiches are. Choose a sandwich named for your favorite president along with a seasonal beer or cider.

4 Gauley Bridge

CATHEDRAL FALLS One of the highest and most scenic waterfalls in WV, Cathedral Falls is a steep cascade that falls into a natural amphitheater easily accessible from Route 60.

5 Glen Ferris

KANAWHA FALLS Kanawha Falls, the largest waterfall in WV, is impressively wide and has water year-round. Stop by in any season for a quick photo op.

6 Lansing

BEAUTY MOUNTAIN

(Fred Dillon) "Beauty Mountain is

a little-known rock formation on the New River Gorge. It's a short hike with a spectacular view and a great place for a quiet picnic with friends."

BRIDGE WALK

Experience the New River Gorge from 851 feet above the water. Participants are harnessed in to cross the 1.25-mile bridge on a 24-inch catwalk.

THEATER Take in a movie at dusk, Memorial Day through Labor Day. Perfect for a family outing or even a first date.

1 Historic Downtown Lewisburg

CARNEGIE HALL One of only four Carnegie Halls still in use in the world, this cultural center serves more than 75,000 patrons a year with live performances, art exhibits and workshops.

HISTORIC GENERAL LEWIS INN

Built in the early 1800s, the inn is a blend of old and new, like canopy beds and free Wi-Fi. Combined with on-site dining and close proximity to the State Fair of WV and Greenbrier State Forest, the inn promises a unique stay.

JIM'S DRIVE IN A drive-up restaurant with an old-time feel,

enjoy hamburgers, homemade chili, fried green tomatoes, deep-fried pickles and a delicious ice cream cone for dessert.

SMOOTH AMBLER SPIRITS

This distillery upholds the old Appalachian tradition with its production of world-class whiskeys and white spirits.

SNAKE ROCK

(David Gillispie) "At the end of Slab Camp Road is Snake Rock, a huge piece of rock 300 feet in the air that overlooks a beautiful field, spacious mountains, the Greenbrier River and a couple of bald eagles that have taken up residence there."

4 Ronceverte

ORGAN CAVE Organ Cave is a science and history hotspot housing more than 70 miles of passageways. See where over 1,100 Confederate soldiers hid for three winters, or learn about unique fossils discovered there.

5 White Sulphur Springs

LAKE SHERWOOD RECREATION

AREA Lake Sherwood is the complete family destination. Tent camp, fish or explore the Meadow Mountain Trail for the ultimate vacation.

APPALACHIAN NATIONAL SCENIC TRAIL

Harpers Ferry is the midpoint

of this 2,180-mile trail that runs through the Appalachian Mountains. The WV portion, which includes four miles of elevations varying between 265-1,200 feet, lies mainly in historic Harpers Ferry.

HARPERS FERRY

(Joseph Young) "I have been all over the state, and my favorite area is between Shepherdstown and Harpers Ferry. There is a magical feeling there along the river, with Civil War locations as the focal point."

HARPERS FERRY NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK

Take a step into the past and explore the battlefield where abolitionist John Brown tried to initiate an armed slave revolt in 1859 by taking over a U.S. arsenal.

JEFFERSON ROCK

Located above the Appalachian Trail, this rock named after Thomas Jefferson provides an unforgettable view of the Potomac River. Hikers can climb 62 stone steps to where Jefferson once admired the scenery.

RIVER RIDERS CANOPY TOUR

Experience Harpers Ferry from the treetops with River Riders' zipline canopy tour. This network of cables and skybridges overlooks the Harpers Ferry water gap, Potomac River, rock cliffs, wildlife, trees and plants.

3 Kearneysville

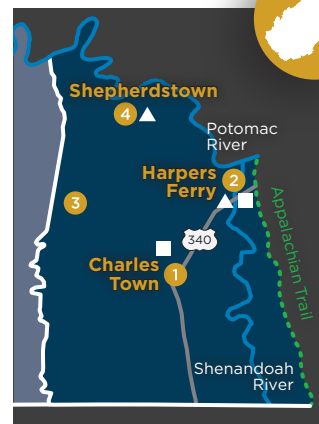
BLACK DOG COFFEE

CASS SCENIC RAILROAD

STATE PARK Take a self-guided tour of this boom town, and ride a restored Shay locomotive to Bald Knob, the third highest point in WV. From there, the view lets you see over two states.

3 Dunmore

THORNY MOUNTAIN FIRE

TOWER Spend the night in this tower, and you'll wake up with a bird's-eye view of WV. Climb 69 steps to access the one-room cabin that stands at 3,445 feet above sea level.

4 Green Bank

NATIONAL RADIO ASTRONOMY OBSERVATORY

(Katie Allie) "There aren't many places in the world where the light pollution is low enough that you can have an observatory like this. I vividly remember camping nearby and just being in awe of the night sky."

5 Hillsboro

CRANBERRY WILDERNESS

(Kelly Drey) "This is my favorite place in WV. The hiking trails there are top-notch, but the opportunity to experience solitude in a beautiful natural area is the real selling point."

DROOP MOUNTAIN BATTLEFIELD STATE PARK

The site of WV's last significant Civil War battle, the state park is perfectly positioned near Lewisburg—"America's Coolest Small Town"—and the Greenbrier River Valley, making it ideal for an all-inclusive day trip.

FALLS OF HILLS CREEK

This series of three falls, falling at 20, 45 and 65 feet respectively, is considered the glittering jewel of the Monongahela National Forest.

6 Huntersville

DEVIL'S BACKBONE AT HUNTERSVILLE

One of three Devil's Backbones in WV, this unique Tuscarora sandstone rock formation can be seen from Route 39 and is popular with scenic drive enthusiasts.

7 Marlinton

GREENBRIER RIVER TRAIL

(Rich West) "I have always loved the Greenbrier River Trail. I actually biked the entire thing, and I think the history of the tracks is, well, a-track-tive!"

TEA CREEK TRAILS

(April Goff Smithson) "Our family loves to spend time camping, fishing and hiking at Tea Creek on the Williams River. The remote location allows us to disconnect and truly focus on each other."

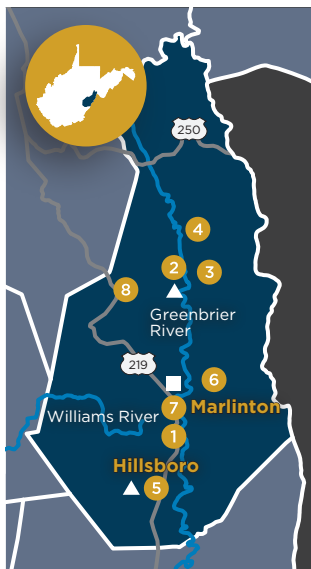

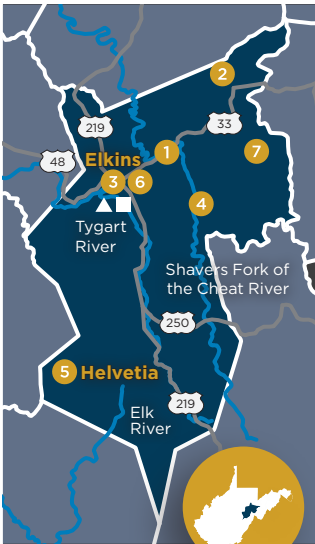
OTTER CREEK WILDERNESS

BIG TIMBER BREWING COMPANY
Visit the microbrewery and taproom and enjoy a blonde ale, porter or a variety of different pale ales, all produced in the heart of WV.

EL GRAN SABOR An authentic Venezuelan restaurant, El Gran Sabor is a unique place with a

great story. Stop by for some cachapas, a chicken chipotle sandwich and live entertainment.

MOUNTAIN STATE FOREST FESTIVAL One of WV's oldest and largest festivals, this week-long event has much to see and do. Set aside a couple of days during the first week of October to attend this annual event.

4 Gladly

HIGH FALLS OF CHEAT
At an altitude of 2,800 feet, High Falls is considered one of the most beautiful waterfalls in Monongahela National Forest. Reach the falls by way of the Tygart Flyer and make a day of it.

5 Helvetia

HONEY HAUS Enjoy a specialty coffee or tea with a homemade pastry at the Honey Haus, and pick up locally produced honey, jam or jelly for the road.

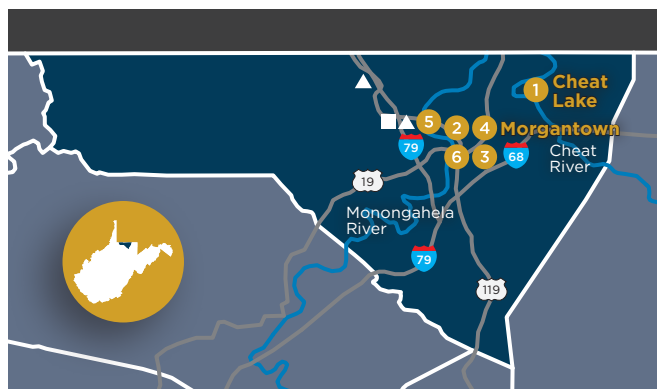

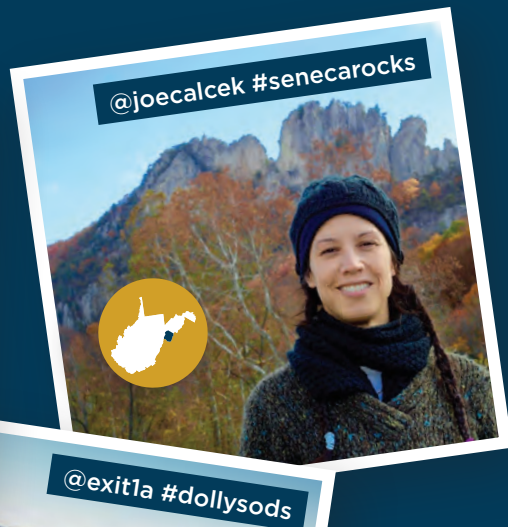

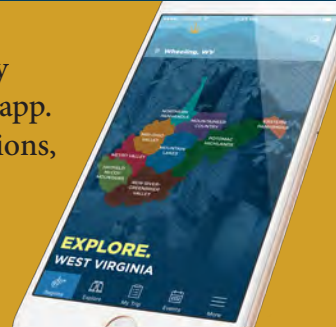
Home of the Steel Drivin' Man, this park is named for the beloved folk hero and offers educational interpretations of John Henry's battle, local railroad history and recreational amenities.
